As Elie put it in his Nobel Peace Prize acceptance speech on the danger of silence and indifference in the face of evil, that is why I swore never to be silent whenever and wherever human beings endure suffering and humiliation – apartheid is, in my view, as abhorrent as anti-semitism. As an author, he has been awarded a number of literary prizes and is considered among the most important in describing the Holocaust from a highly personal perspective. People all over the world were devastated by this horrendous act, and there are still people today who have not overcome its effects. Hitler had targeted specifically the Jewish population because of his hatred towards them. Wiesel and his father were later deported to the concentration camp at Buchenwald. The atrocities committed by the Nazis might have strangled hope and joy, but the flame of life refused to perish. Elie Wiesel in *The three 'veteran' prisoners, needles in hands, tattooed numbers on our left arms. My parents will have more children. The Jewish would fight for the right to live as they were killed solely for being Jewish. It is the other way around – that if there had been an Israel, there might well not have been a Holocaust, or the horrors of Jewish history. They were Jews! This is how I always felt about the person who was my teacher, mentor, role model, inspiration and friend of 50 years – in a word, the most remarkable and inspirational human being I have ever encountered and had the honour to work with in common cause. The couple had one son, Elisha. The disturbing disregard for human beings, or the human body itself, still to this day, exacerbates fear in the hearts of men and women. Indeed, the Yiddish title was a more compelling and revealing one, but which, like the book itself, was condensed in translation – pages in the French edition and pages in the English one. As Elie put it: At least there would have been a place for refuge. I have been in the former Yugoslavia last fall. His message is one of peace, atonement and human dignity. Citation Information.
